1 In the year that king Uzziah died
B Ab C#m A
I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple.

2 Above it stood the seraphim: each one had six wings;

with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly.

3 And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts:

the whole earth is full of his glory.

4 And the posts of the door moved at the voice of him that cried, and the house was filled with smoke.

9 And he said, Go, and tell this people, Hear ye indeed, but understand not;

and see ye indeed, but perceive not.

10 Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes;

lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart,
Ab C#m B A Ab
and convert, and be healed. 11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered,
C#m F#m E Ab
Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant,
C#m F#m E Ab
and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,
C#m F#m E Ab
12 And the LORD have removed men far away, and there be a great forsaking in the midst of the land.
C#m F#m E Ab
13 But yet in it shall be a tenth, and it shall return, and shall be eaten:

as a teil tree, and as an oak, whose substance is in them, when they cast their leaves:

so the holy seed shall be the substance thereof.
